



Montreal Natural Resources and Environmental Economics Workshop

Description

This workshop is intended for researchers and doctoral students in economics throughout Montreal who are interested in resource and environmental economics. The types of topics that may be dealt with, at an advanced level, are the economic theory of sustainable growth, green accounting, sunk costs and production constraints in natural resource exploitation, the irreversibility of environmental investment decisions, measures of biodiversity and their implications, the optimal order of extraction of natural resources, intertemporal depletion of spatially distributed nonrenewable resources, property rights and natural resource exploitation, applications of differential games to natural resource and environmental economics, and other related topics.

Participants

The workshop will be led by a team of researchers composed of **Hassan Bencheekroun (McGill University)**, **Robert Cairns (McGill University)**, **G rard Gaudet (Universit  de Montr al)**, **Pierre Lasserre (Universit  du Qu bec   Montr al)**, **Justin Leroux (HEC Montr al)** and **Ngo Van Long (McGill University)**, who will actively participate in each meeting. A regular and active participation will also be expected of the doctoral students and other researchers who would like to join this work group. Visiting researchers will be invited occasionally. All activities will be mainly in English.
