### *CIREQ Interdisciplinary PhD Student Symposium on Climate Change*

**June 17-18, 2021**

Climate change has taken central stage in recent debates, it is a defining challenge of our time. According to Mark Carney, the former head of the Bank of Canada who serves as the UN's special envoy for climate change and finance, "We can't self-isolate from climate change. - economics and finance of climate change;
- environmental science, management and engineering;
- climate change political science and sociology.

Notifications of acceptance will be sent by May 26.

There is no submission or registration fee for the symposium.
